D&RGW C-25 Class Narrow Gauge 2-8-0
LIVE STEAM, ACL—LIMITED PRODUCTION



The Denver & Rio Grande Western Rail Road only owned a single C-25 class locomotive, the '375'. Built by Baldwin (construction number 21757) and delivered in 1903 to the Crystal River RR in Colorado. It was a large engine for a 3-foot gauge locomotive, and could pull a lot of freight in mountainous territory. Its tractive effort (25,000 pounds, the basis of the "25" in the class designation). The locomotive was nicknamed "Baby Mudhen", in reference to its capabilities being similar to a K-27 "Mudhen" unit. It was scrapped in 21-Jun-1949

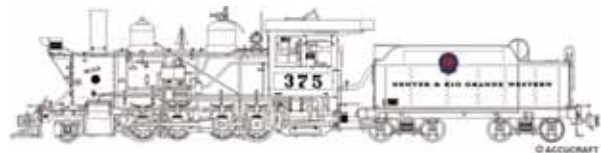
